### **Principal's Report**

Dear Parents, Guardians and Carers

It is that time of the year again when we ask you to complete the Parent/Caregiver/Guardian survey. Please tell us what you think!

This year all families will be sent an invite link and password via your compass email account. MNPS is conducting the survey to find out what parents / caregivers / guardians think of our school. It is an annual survey offered by the Department of Education that is designed to assist schools in gaining an understanding of families' perceptions of school climate, student behaviour, and student engagement. The survey is optional, but we encourage all those invited to participate. Our school will use the survey results to help inform and direct future school planning and improvement strategies. School staff and school council get to see your responses as part of this process. The survey is conducted online, only takes 20 minutes to complete, and can be accessed at any convenient time until Friday the 19th of September on desktop computers, laptops, tablets or smartphones. The online survey will be available in English and other languages including Vietnamese. Through school council our results can accessed, and parts will be communicated to parents/caregivers/guardians and through annual reporting. Please ring and speak the office if you would like more information or have questions on the survey.




