Principal's Report

Dear Parents and Friends.

Welcome back to a cold start to Term 3! Mr Snell has been lucky to escape the recent chilly weather while he enjoys some well-deserved leave for the first three weeks of the term. We also extend our best wishes to Mr Collins, who will be fulfilling the role of Acting Principal at Meeniyan Primary School this term.

Despite the absence of our school leaders, our students have transitioned smoothly back into school routines following what we hope was a relaxing break.

Term 3 is a nine-week term and will conclude on Friday, 19th September. With the colder and wetter weather upon us, we'd like to remind families of two important points:

Uniforms: Please ensure your child is dressed appropriately for the weather in a *named* school uniform. We frequently find ourselves unable to return unnamed items of clothing.

Road safety: Wet roads and children can be a risky mix. Please drive carefully around the school, especially during drop-off and pick-up times. Although children are reminded to use crossings and show care near driveways, they can still be unpredictable. We ask all drivers to take extra caution.

NAIDOC Week

This week, our school celebrated NAIDOC Week, which was officially observed during the first week of the school holidays. This year's theme, "The Next Generation: Strength, Vision & Legacy," marks the 50th anniversary of NAIDOC and highlights the strength of young Indigenous leaders, the vision of their communities, and the legacy of their ancestors.

We would like to thank Mr McDonald, our school's Marrung Lead, and Anne-Maree Stever, our Koorie Engagement Support Officer, for organising a fantastic range of well-attended activities. These included sand drawing, hand-painting earrings and rocks, beading bracelets and cooking.

We would also like to extend our appreciation to Mirboo North Secondary College and their students for supporting this celebration. Throughout the week, they taught our students *Yulunga Games* (traditional Indigenous games) during P.E. sessions and shared Dreamtime Stories with our junior classes. We encourage families to participate in conversations at home to reflect on the cultural significance of these activities.

NAPLAN

NAPLAN results were sent home today with our Grade 3 and Grade 5 students. These individual student reports provide a snapshot of your child's progress in literacy and numeracy and are just one component of our school's overall assessment and reporting process. While they offer useful insights, it's important to remember they reflect performance on a single day and should be considered alongside regular classroom learning and teacher assessments.

Overall, our students performed above the average of our network schools in all but one category and exceeded the average for similar schools in more than half of the categories.

This is a terrific result for our dedicated teachers and the broader school community and is a reflection of the improvements we have made in literacy and numeracy instruction over recent years.

Parent-Teacher Interviews

Appointments for Parent–Teacher Interviews will open via Compass on Monday, 4th August, with interviews taking place on Tuesday, 12th August. A reminder will be sent out via a Compass message on the day that appointments are made available.

As in previous years, students will attend school until 12:00pm on this day. We understand that some families, particularly those with children who travel by bus, may not be able to collect their child early. Supervision will be provided for those who remain at school, and buses will operate as normal. Please notify the office if your child will need to stay until the end of the regular school day.

Canteen Closure Day

Next week on Friday 1st August, our school canteen will be closed. Although you will not be able to order a lunch order for this day, the secondary college's VOS (student representative group) will be holding a sausage sizzle. Primary school students who wish to make a purchase will be invited to do so during our eating time.


