

Relationships Australia (Caitlyn) has been supporting MNPS since 2023> Caitlyn works fortnightly, with some of our students. She has been with us from the start, and has supported many students on their journey.

Last year, Uniting, also started with MNPS. Unfortunately, they had to postpone their counselling sessions last term due to funding, however we are excited to share that they are back with us for term 3 and 4!

Brylee is our new counsellor and she started this week. She will be working fortnightly and we welcome her to the MNPS fold.

Some parents will be receiving a phone call from Brylee (if they have not already) to reassess the referrals made earlier this year. If you do not think your child needs counselling anymore, please let Brylee know and we will move to the next person on the waitlist.

However, if you think your child **would** benefit from some external support, please touch base with Sarah and she will help you with the referral process and add your child's name to the current waitlist.

Material D<u>rive</u>

To help with costs we are going to run a material drive.

Some people MIGHT have some of the following in their sheds, gardens or hanging around.

If you do, and can help, please touch base with Sarah. Thankyou!!

For our native bee hotels we will need:

- Bamboo (the older & drier the better)
- Pithy stems like lamiaceae, lantana,
- Any dead flower stems, ie. kangaroo paw, dead agapanthus stems, native reeds,
- PVC pipe, (approx 50-70mm diameter)
- tin cans, or other recycled hollow tubes that can be used as an outer casing to hold bamboo.
- Paper bark, or something like bark, to wrap the pvc pipes or containers to make them beautiful,
- Clay,
- Sand,
- Thin wire/string,
- Besser blocks or ceramic pipe,
- native hardwood cut to lengths of approx ~200mm.
